15s wool subsidy on exports of 7½ sacks of wool @ 2s/sack

Wine: Imports of 28 tuns of wine @ 12d/tun

Free of subsidy: 1000 quarters of wheat (*frumentum*) worth £220, which Henry, earl of Lancaster, exported in the ship *la Dieulagard de Bajona* via Sandwich, by authority of a *supersedeas omnino* dated 13 Mar. 24 Edw. III/1350 to the customers [not enrolled] in respect of all demands for payment of subsidy on exports of grain and other victuals and goods (*bladum et aliis victualibus et rebus*) in the said ship in the name of the earl destined for Gascony, because he is in Gascony on royal service (*in obsequio regis*)

Free of subsidy: 9 bales (*bale*) of cloth containing 72 whole cloths (*panni integri*) worth £150, 3 tuns with saddles (3 *dolia cellis impleta*) worth £10 belonging to Peter Garseye; 6 bales of cloth containing 48 whole cloths worth £100 belonging to William Tongane; 3 bales of cloth containing 23 whole cloths worth £60 and 3 tuns with saddles (3 *dolia cellis impleta*) worth £10 belonging to Gerard Camboun, merchant of Bordeaux and servant of the said Peter [Garseye] and William [Tongane], by authority of a royal mandate dated 8 Apr. 24 Edw. III/1350 [not enrolled], by which the king — having heard the plaint (*querela*) of Gerard Camboun in his as well as in the name of the other servants of Peter and William, Arnald Ganselmere^a and Bernard de la Camynad, namely that all the said goods had been bought in Flanders and were destined for Bordeaux, but were landed in Sandwich *pro defectu navium inter Flandriam et Burdegalam* and reloaded in the ship *la Seint Johan de Bajona* (captain Peter Reymound Bardi) in order to be transported to Bordeaux — ordered that the goods be free of subsidy, if the customers determine that they were not intended for sale in Sandwich

Free of subsidy: 120 tuns of wine imported by Peter Feure and Amanenus Daryet from Bordeaux in the ship *le Cogge Sancti Martini de Bajona*, by authority of a *supersedeas omnino* dated 7 June 24 Edw. III/1350 [not enrolled] in respect of demands for subsidy on the wine sold to the king and to Edward, Prince of Wales prior to the grant of the subsidy
